It is the student's responsibility to monitor the completion of the Minimum Admission Requirements (MAR) whether enrolled at CVCC (Catawba Valley Community College) or elsewhere. CVCC reserves the right to change curriculum and admission requirements without prior notice. Applicants are responsible for completing admission requirements and ensuring all materials have been submitted by the deadline and as directed.

This packet provides information to assist you with the admission and selection process for the Dental Hygiene program. What is the class schedule/length for the Dental Hygiene program?

The core dental hygiene courses are only offered during the day on a full-time basis. The program consists of seven semesters, which require two years to complete after all program pre-requisites are satisfied. The program begins in the Fall term. Graduates of the program are eligible, with approval of the Dental Hygiene Program Director, to take the National Board Dental Hygiene Examination and the CITA Examination, as well as other state or regional examinations depending upon requirements. Graduates applying for NC Licensure will be required to undergo criminal record checks and fingerprinting.

How much does the program cost?

How much does the program cost? College tuition is set by the North Carolina State Legislature and is subject to change. Dental Hygiene students must purchase a variety of books, instruments, clinic uniforms, malpractice insurance, accident insurance, and other fees as set by the College. The approximate cost for the program is \$9,500 (This figure is based upon current in-state tuition rates and reflects an approximate cost only). Information regarding the estimated additional program costs is listed on CVCC's **Dental Hygiene webpage**.

How do I apply for Financial Aid?

All applicants are encouraged to apply for financial aid by completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). For information about financial aid, contact the Office of Scholarships and Financial Aid at financial_aid@cvcc.edu or call 828-327-7000 ext. 4860.

Do I need a computer?

Yes, access to a computer is required for this program. Once the CVCC application has been activated, students are assigned a CVCC email address and MyCVCC Portal account. Communication between students, faculty and any other college personnel will be by CVCC email, so students must frequently check their CVCC email accounts for admission status updates.

The following technology resources are recommended for successful completion of this program:

A laptop computer with

- · Windows 10 or later with at least 4GB of RAM (6GB or more preferred) and at least 3GB Hard Drive capacity (more preferred)
- · Web Camera and Microphone
- · Installation of Microsoft Office Suite & Teams (provided by CVCC)

- · Installation of the free Google Chrome, Mozilla Firefox, or newest Microsoft Edge browser (Chrome recommended)
- · Reliable Internet Access and Printer Access

Cell phones are not a substitute for laptops; they cannot be used to complete assignments for this program.

Will I be required to complete a Criminal Background Check/Drug Screening?

Yes. Clinical facilities will require students to undergo criminal background checks, drug testing and have certain immunizations/vaccines. The NC State Board of Dental Examiners uses LiveScan to complete the criminal background check. A student is required to complete a criminal background check when applying for a NC Dental Hygiene license.

Students will be required to pay fees associated with background checks/drug screenings.

Clinical facilities may refuse access to clinical experiences based upon results of a criminal background check, drug screening or immunization/vaccination status.

Should any facility refuse to allow a student access to a clinical experience, the student will be unable to continue in the CVCC Dental Hygiene program.

Predetermination of Eligibility for Licensure: Individuals with a criminal history may petition the North Carolina State Board of Dental Examiners any time prior to applying for a license to determine if the individual's criminal history will likely disqualify them from obtaining a license. Individuals may receive such a predetermination through either a formal or an informal process. How does undocumented immigrant status or DACA status affect application to the program?

Current North Carolina Community College System policy allows DACA and undocumented applicants to enroll at CVCC at the out of state tuition cost. However, acceptance to the college does not guarantee acceptance to a specific program. Students with an unexpired DACA status are eligible to apply to an Allied Health program. Students must keep active DACA status to remain enrolled in an Allied Health program. Professional licensure is granted by state licensing boards. Students MUST inquire with the appropriate licensure board for specific licensure requirements. Undocumented students are not eligible for admission to an Allied Health program. According to North Carolina and Federal laws, undocumented students are not eligible for North Carolina professional licensure. This policy is subject to change without notice based upon federal and state regulations.

When and how will I be notified of acceptance to the program?

Applicants will be notified of acceptance to the program within 2 to 6 weeks of the deadline via an email to their CVCC email account. Applicants chosen as alternates or not accepted for the program will also be notified at that time. Students may apply to only one healthcare program at a time. Should acceptance to that program be denied, the student may apply to another healthcare program whose application deadline has not yet occurred.

What if I am not admitted to the program?

Applicants not admitted will need to re-apply by completing the MAR Checklist for the year of reapplication. Students are responsible for following the guidelines for reapplication. Students are required to submit a new MAR Checklist each year to apply.

What am I required to do before the first day of class if accepted?

Accepted applicants must attend a mandatory Orientation Session with the Dental Hygiene Program Director and Faculty at which time the student will be provided with information concerning other program requirements, including Healthcare Provider CPR certification, health examination form certifying that he/she appears to be able to participate in the activities of a health profession in a clinical setting, uniforms, and additional program costs. Students not attending the Orientation Session and/or unable to meet any additional requirements listed above will be unable to enter the Dental Hygiene program.

MINIMUM ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS (MAR) EXPLAINED

To be considered for acceptance, all applicants must complete Minimum Admission Requirements (MAR) by the published deadline.

- 1. Complete the **CVCC Application** with "Dental Hygiene" as your intended major.
- 2. High School Transcript: Submit an official High School/High School Equivalency transcript in a sealed envelope issued by the school, electronically through a 3rd party vendor to transcripts@cvcc.edu or by postal mail. Official, Sealed High School/High School Equivalency Transcript must be received before the published deadline. Plan accordingly to ensure transcripts arrive by the deadline. Applicants seeking information on how to request transcripts may visit How to Request Official Transcripts.
- 3. College Transcripts: Submit ALL official college transcripts from EVERY school ever attended (except CVCC) in a sealed envelope issued from the school, electronically through a 3rd party vendor to transcripts@cvcc. edu or by postal mail. All Official, Sealed College Transcripts from all originating institutions must be received before the published deadline. Plan accordingly to ensure transcripts arrive by the deadline.
- **4. Attend the CVCC Dental Hygiene Information Session:** Applicants must attend a mandatory Dental Hygiene Information Session. Refer to the **Dental Hygiene webpage** for the complete session list.
- 5. Meet Required CVCC Grade Point Average (GPA) of 3.00:
 - Students previously or currently enrolled at CVCC must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.00 on all CVCC coursework. Applicants who have not attended CVCC but have completed at least 6 curriculum course credit hours at another regionally accredited college or university and earned a cumulative GPA of at least 3.00 or higher may use that GPA.
- 6. Completed all required courses listed in the Pre-Admission Coursework Guide with a minimum grade of "C" or higher.
- 7. Complete the ATI TEAS (Test of Essential Academic Skills) exam. Every applicant must take the TEAS exam before the deadline.
 - Students may take their exam online. Please refer to the ATI TEAs website to register for the exam. Applicants taking the TEAS must request an official score report from ATI to be sent to CVCC before the deadline. The highest score within three years will be used (January 31, 2021, to January 31, 2024).
- 8. Submit the completed MAR Checklist before the deadline.
 - From the applicant's CVCC email account, submit the completed MAR Checklist to healthcare@cvcc.edu.

COMPETITIVE SELECTION AND RANKING

The following criteria will be used to evaluate and select the best-qualified applicants from those who completed all Minimum Admission Requirements (MAR) by the deadline. Applicants receiving the highest number of points will be admitted to the program until the class is filled. The number of students accepted each year may vary depending on clinical space.

- 1. Points for completion (with a "C" or better) of ALL Dental Hygiene Program prerequisite General Education Courses. Applicants are not considered for the program if the courses are not completed. (Found on the Pre-Admission Coursework Guide)
- 2. Applicants who graduated with a diploma from a CODA-accredited Dental Assisting Program or who have earned DANB's Certified Dental Assistant (CDA) or completed CVCC's Dental Assisting Program and earned the National Entry Level Dental Assistant (NELDA) certification will earn extra points in the competitive admission process.

CVCC will only consider a CODA-accredited or a DANB-accepted program for CDA or NELDA certification at the time of applicant's graduation/completion. Visit www.danb.org for a list of accredited schools. Transcripts showing coursework and graduation date from the CODA-accredited Dental Assisting Program must be provided and received by the published deadline date. Applicants who completed the Dental Assisting Program at CVCC do not need to submit transcripts but will need to submit the NELDA certificate by the published deadline date.

3. Applicants will be awarded points according to their score on the TEAS exam.

There is no limit on the number of times an applicant may take the TEAS test. To be considered, official test scores sent electronically by ATI must be received by the deadline date. Scores within the last three years will be considered and the highest total score will be used.

DENTAL HYGIENE- INFORMATION FOR DENTAL ASSISTANT I OR II DOCUMENTATION

All documentation must be submitted by the published deadline.

Applicants who completed the Dental Assisting I (DA I) Program at CVCC AND obtained the DANB NELDA certification will earn extra points. The applicant must email the NELDA certificate to healthcare@cvcc.edu. This is not required and is optional for applicants.

Applicants who are a Dental Assistant II (DA II) in NC will earn extra points in the competitive admission process. This is not required and is optional for applicants.

The Applicant (and Dentist, where specified) must complete the documentation outlined below to confirm the Applicant's DA II status.

There are two ways an Applicant may provide documentation for DA II status:

- 1. Applicants who successfully completed an ADA CODA accredited Dental Assisting Program and obtained a DANB CDA certificate must submit both of the following documents:
 - **a.** The official transcript from the ADA CODA accredited Dental Assisting program along with the CDA certificate must be submitted to CVCC (electronically through a 3rd party vendor or sent in postal mail from the issuing school to CVCC); and
 - **b.** Complete Section A of the "Dental Hygiene—DA II Documentation Form" and email it to **healthcare@cvcc.edu.**

OR

- 2. Applicants who did not complete the Dental Assisting I program at CVCC and obtain the DANB NELDA certificate, nor graduate from an ADA CODA accredited Dental Assisting Program, nor have a DANB CDA certificate must provide evidence of all four of the following items per NC Law in order to be considered for a DA II:
 - **a.** Complete Section B of the "Dental Hygiene–DA II Documentation Form" to provide evidence of full-time employment and experience as a chairside assistant for two years (3000 hours) within the past 5 years. The Applicant and the Dentist must complete the form. Applicants may submit the form to **healthcare@cvcc.edu**.
 - **b.** Submit the following three (3) certificates to **healthcare@cvcc.edu**.
 - A 3-hour course in sterilization and infection control
 - A 3-hour course in dental office emergencies
 - Radiology Training consistent with G.S. 90-29(s)(12)

The applicant must scan and email this form to healthcare@cvcc.edu. Late submissions, or those emailed to another address will not be considered.

Applicants may need to copy this form if fulltime employment and experience as a chairside assistant for two (2) years occurred at multiple dental practices. Applicants are responsible for ensuring all documentation is submitted as directed and by the deadline.

DENTAL HYGIENE - TECHNICAL STANDARDS

Catawba Valley Community College does not discriminate against qualified individuals with disabilities and will attempt to provide reasonable accommodations as required by law. CRITICAL THINKING	Cognitive ability sufficient to recognize deviations from normal cases, co-diagnose, and plan treatment.	Respond quickly and appropriately to medical emergencies. Utilize assessment information to identify pathology, individualize treatment, and suggest referral when necessary.
COMMUNICATION SKILLS	Written, verbal & auditory communication skills to permit effective interaction with others.	Communicate with staff members, patients and other students while wearing high filtration masks. Ascertain medical/dental history information. Monitor patient needs during treatment. Provide individualized homecare instructions.
MOBILITY	Sufficient mobility to maneuver in small areas.	Access patient within confines of dental operatory and radiographic room, which involves a variety of sitting and; standing positions, including bending, twisting and reaching. Access darkroom for development of radiographs.
MOTOR SKILLS	Fine and gross motor skills sufficient to perform complex psychomotor tasks.	Exploring and scaling teeth with small diameter instruments. Manipulating power-driven instruments. Placing dental radiographs.
VISUAL	Visual ability sufficient to read medical information and assess dental conditions.	Annotate chart entries on paper and/ or computerized medical records. Assess intraoral conditions. Interpret dental radiographs.
OCCUPATIONAL EXPOSURES	The dental hygiene student may be exposed to communicable diseases, bodily fluids, toxic substances, latex and medicinal preparations. Students shall use appropriate precautions at all times.	Provide care, using standard precaution, for a client/patient with a communicable disease.

The following courses must be completed with a grade of "C" or higher by the published deadline:

BIO 168 – Anatomy and Physiology I (4 credit hours) **BIO 163** with a "C" or higher will substitute.

BIO 275 – Microbiology (4 credit hours) **BIO 175** with a "C" or higher will substitute.

CHM 130 & 130A - Gen., Org. & Biochemistry & Lab (4 credit hours)

CHM 131, 131A & 132 are the only substitutions for CHM 130 & 130A. Completing all 3 courses with a "C" or higher in every course will substitute.

COM 110 – Introduction to Communication (3 credit hours) **COM 120** (3 credit hours) or COM 231 (3 credit hours) will substitute.

ENG 111 - Writing and Inquiry (3 credit hours)

ENG 112 – Writing/Research in the Disciplines (3 credit hours) **OR**

ENG 114 - Professional Research and Reporting (3 credit hours)
